

## RIPPLE SCARF AND BERET

Vintage Crochet Pattern



### Scarf

#### You will need:

- Knitting worsted-weight yarn—8 ounces [227 grams] of Color A and 4 ounces [113 grams] each of Colors B and C.
- 1 size K crochet hook or whatever size for the correct gauge.

#### Gauge:

Measuring across,  
5 single crochets = 2 inches.  
Point to point,  
each pattern repeat = 3 inches across.

#### Finished measurements:

The scarf is approximately 9 inches wide by 78 inches long.

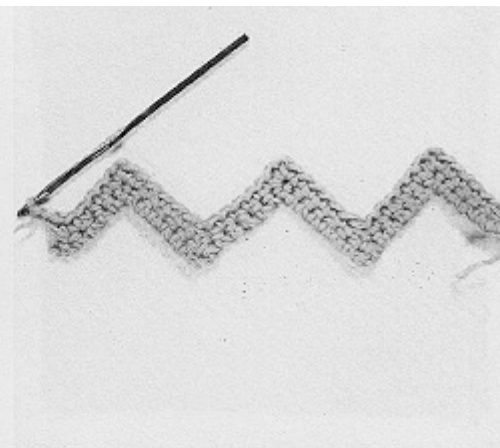
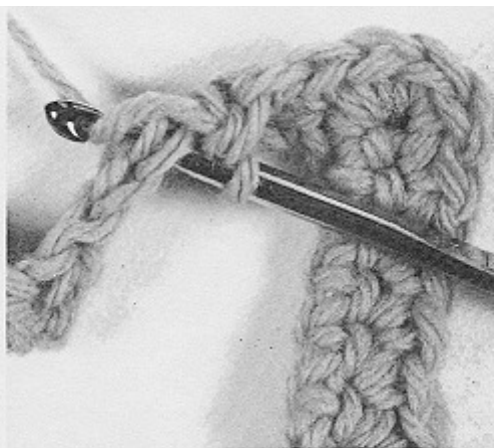
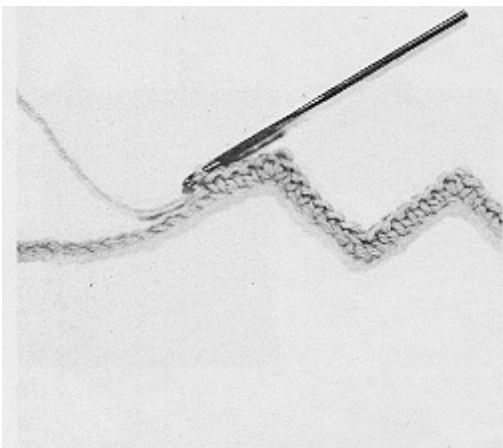
### Hat

#### You will need:

- Knitting worsted-weight yarn—4 ounces [113 grams].
- 1 size J crochet hook or whatever size for the correct gauge.

#### Gauge:

Measuring across,  
4 single crochets = 1 inch.  
Top to bottom,  
7 rounds = 2 inches.

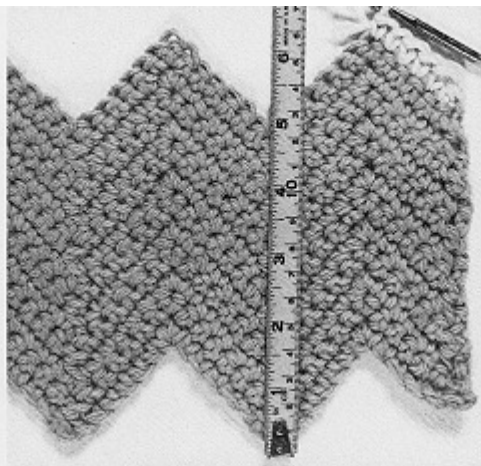


**Scarf: 1)** With Color A, chain 40.

**2)** This row is on the right side of the work. Work 1 single crochet in the second chain from the hook, 1 single crochet in each of the next 4 chains, 3 single crochets in the next chain and 1 single crochet in each of the next 5 chains; draw up a loop in the next chain, skip the next chain and draw up a loop in the next chain, then wrap the yarn over the hook and draw it through all 3 loops on the hook. Work 1 single crochet in each of the next 5 chains, 3

single crochets in the next chain, and 1 single crochet in each of the next 5 chains; draw up a loop in the next chain, skip the next chain and draw up a loop in the next chain, then wrap the yarn over the hook and draw it through all 3 loops on the hook. Work 1 single crochet in each of the next 5 chains, 3 single crochets in the next chain and 1 single crochet in each of the last 5 chains.

**3)** Chain 1 and turn the work around. Draw up a loop in each of the first 2 stitches, then wrap the yarn over the hook and draw it through all 3 loops on the hook. Work 1 single crochet in each of the next 4 single crochets, 3 single crochets in the next single crochet, and 1 single crochet in each of the next 5 single crochets; draw up a loop in the next single crochet, skip the next single crochet and draw up a loop in the next single crochet, then wrap the yarn over the hook and draw it through all 3 loops on the hook. Work



1 single crochet in each of the next 5 single crochets, 3 single crochets in the next single crochet, and 1 single crochet in each of the next 5 single crochets; draw up a loop in the next single crochet, skip the next single crochet, and draw up a loop in the next single crochet, then wrap the yarn over the hook and draw it through all 3 loops on the hook. Work 1 single crochet in each of the next 5 single crochets, 3 single crochets in the next single crochet, and 1 single crochet in

each of the next 4 single crochets; draw up a loop in each of the last 2 single crochets, wrap the yarn over the hook and draw it through all 3 loops on the hook.

4) Repeat Step 3.

5) Continue to repeat Step 3 for Ripple Pattern until your piece measures 5 inches from the beginning. Your last row should be a wrong side row. Change to Color B.

6) With Color B, repeat Step 3 twice; change to Color A.

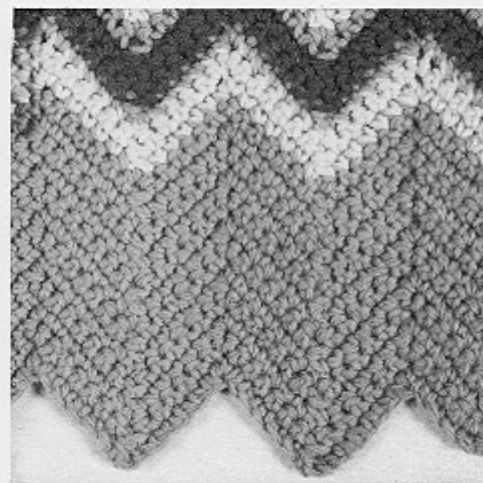
7) With Color A, repeat Step 3 once; change to Color C.

8) With Color C, repeat Step 3 twice; change to Color A.

9) With Color A, repeat Step 3 once; change to Color B.

10) With Color B, repeat Step 3 once; change to Color A.

11) With Color A, repeat Step 3 once; change to Color C.



12) With Color C, repeat Step 3 once; change to Color A.

13) With Color A, repeat Step 3 once; change to Color B.

14) With Color B, repeat Step 3 once; change to Color A.

15) With Color A, repeat Step 3 five times; change to Color B.

16) Repeat Steps 6-14 once.

17) With Color A, repeat Step 3 until your piece measures 60 inches from the beginning. Your last row should be

a wrong side row. Change to Color B.

18) With Color B, repeat Step 3 once; change to Color A.

19) With Color A, repeat Step 3 once; change to Color C.

20) With Color C, repeat Step 3 once; change to Color A.

21) With Color A, repeat Step 3 once; change to Color B.

22) With Color B, repeat Step 3 once; change to Color A.

23) With Color A, repeat Step 3 once;

change to Color C.

24) With Color C, repeat Step 3 twice; change to Color A.

25) With Color A, repeat Step 3 once; change to Color B.

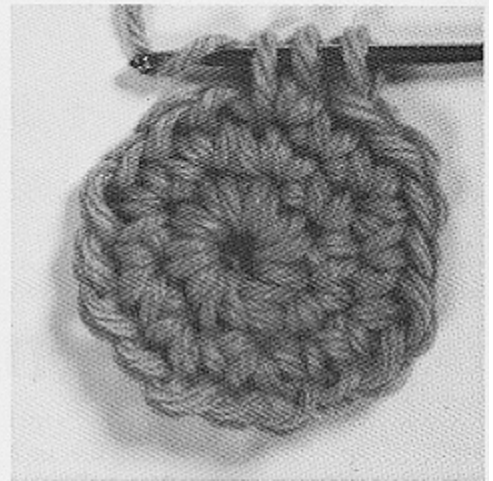
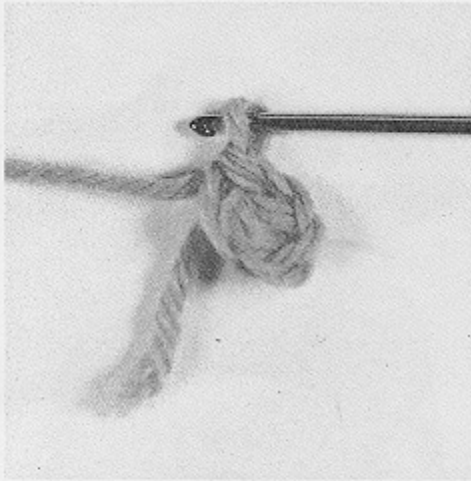
26) With Color B, repeat Step 3 twice; change to Color A.

27) With Color A, repeat Step 3 five times; change to Color B.

28) Repeat Steps 18-26.

29) With Color A, repeat Step 3 for 5 inches.

30) Fasten off.



**Hat: 1)** Starting at the center top of the beret, chain 4. Join with a slip stitch in the first chain made to form a ring.

**2)** Work 8 single crochets in the ring, do not join to the first single crochet. Tie a piece of contrasting color yarn or fasten a safety pin through the top of the last single crochet to mark the end of the round.

**3)** Work 2 single crochets in each of the 8 single crochets. You will now have 16 single crochets. Move the marker to the last stitch of this round.

**4)** Work 1 single crochet in the next single crochet and 2 single crochets in the next single crochet. Continue to work 1 single crochet in the next single crochet and 2 single crochets in the next single crochet, 7 times more. You will now have 24 single crochets. Move the marker to the last stitch of this round.

**5)** Work 1 single crochet in each of the next 2 single crochets and 2 single crochets in the next single crochet. Continue to work 1 single crochet in

each of the next 2 single crochets and 2 single crochets in the next single crochet, 7 times more. You will now have 32 single crochets. Move the marker to the last stitch of this round.

**6)** Work 1 single crochet in each single crochet. Move the marker to the last stitch of this round.

**7)** Work 1 single crochet in each of the next 3 single crochets and 2 single crochets in the next single crochet. Continue to work 1 single crochet in each of the next 3 single crochets and

2 single crochets in the next single crochet around, ending with 2 single crochets in the marked stitch. You will now have 40 single crochets. Move the marker to the last stitch of this round.

**8)** Work 1 single crochet in each single crochet. Move the marker to the last stitch of this round.

**9)** Repeat Steps 7 and 8. You will now have 50 single crochets.

**10)** Work 1 single crochet in each of the next 4 single crochets and 2 single crochets in the next single crochet.

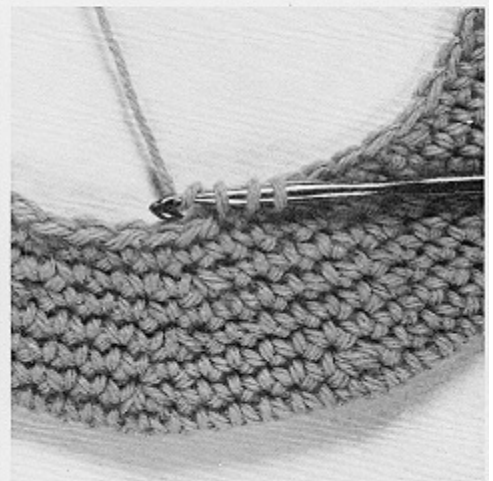
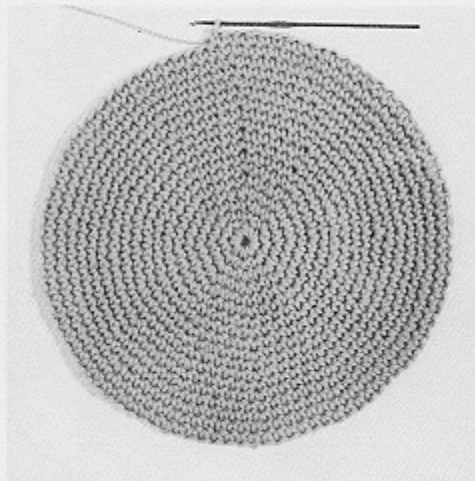
Continue to work 1 single crochet in each of the next 4 single crochets and 2 single crochets in the next single crochet around, ending with 2 single crochets in the marked stitch. You will now have 60 single crochets. Move the marker to the last stitch of this round.

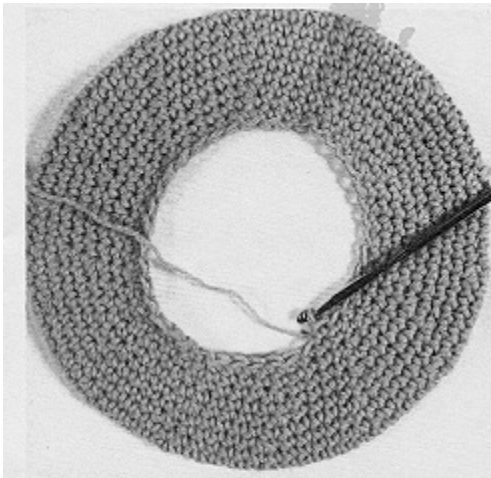
**11)** Work 1 single crochet in each single crochet. Move the marker to the last stitch of this round.

**12)** Repeat Steps 10 and 11. You will now have 72 single crochets.

**13)** Work 1 single crochet in each of the next 5 single crochets and 2 single crochets in the next single crochet. Continue to work 1 single crochet in each of the next 5 single crochets and 2 single crochets in the next single crochet around, ending with 2 single crochets in the marked stitch. You will now have 84 single crochets. Move the marker to the last stitch of the round.

**14)** Work 1 single crochet in each single crochet. Move the marker to the last stitch of this round.





**15)** Repeat Steps 13 and 14. You will now have 98 single crochets.

**16)** Repeat Step 14.

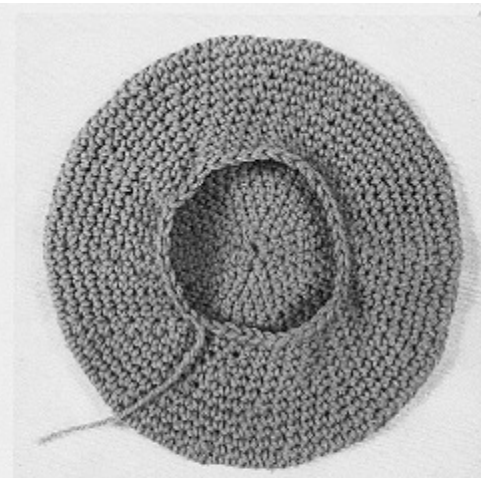
**17)** Work 1 single crochet in each of the next 5 single crochets, draw up a loop in each of the next 2 single crochets, then wrap the yarn over the hook and draw it through all 3 loops on the hook to decrease 1 stitch. Continue to work 1 single crochet in each of the next 5 single crochets, draw up a loop in each of the next 2 single crochets, then wrap the yarn over the hook and

draw it through all 3 loops on the hook around, ending with a decrease over the last 2 stitches. You will now have 84 single crochets. Move the marker to the last stitch of this round.

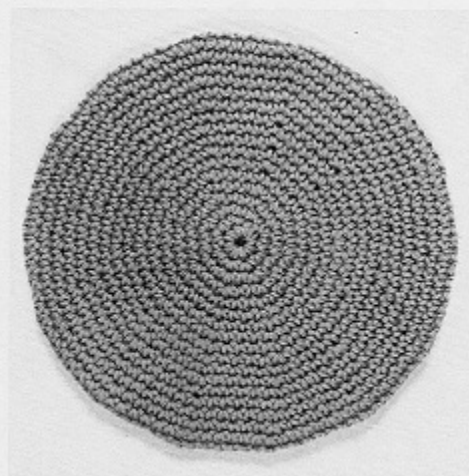
**18)** Work 1 single crochet in each single crochet. Move the marker to the last stitch of this round.

**19)** Repeat Steps 17 and 18. You will now have 72 single crochets.

**20)** Work 1 single crochet in each of the next 4 single crochets, draw up a loop in each of the next 2 single



crochets, then wrap the yarn over the hook and draw it through all 3 loops on the hook. Continue to work 1 single crochet in each of the next 4 single crochets, draw up a loop in each of the next 2 single crochets, then wrap the yarn over the hook and draw it through all 3 loops on the hook around, ending with a decrease over the last 2 stitches. You will now have 60 single crochets. Move the marker to the last stitch of this round.



**21)** Work 1 single crochet in each single crochet. Move the marker to the last stitch of this round.

**22)** Repeat Steps 20 and 21. You will now have 50 single crochets.

**23)** Work 1 single crochet in each of the next 3 single crochets, draw up a loop in each of the next 2 single crochets, then wrap the yarn over the hook and draw it through all 3 loops on

the hook. Continue to work 1 single crochet in each of the next 3 single crochets, draw up a loop in each of the next 2 single crochets, then wrap the yarn over the hook and draw it through all 3 loops on the hook around, ending with a decrease over the last 2 stitches. You will now have 40 single crochets. Move the marker to the last stitch of this round.

**24)** Work 1 single crochet in each single crochet. Move the marker to the last stitch of this round.

**25)** Work 1 single crochet in each single crochet. Remove the marker.

**26)** Slip stitch in the next single crochet and fasten off.
