

Striped Shawl

1960s Crochet Pattern



This versatile design can be worn as a stole or shawl draped around shoulders. The model was made of Columbia-Minerva Reverie which is mohair and orlon combination. It takes about one ounce each of turquoise, bone, coral, cocoa, gold, blue and hot pink or any other desired colors. Use a size H aluminum crochet hook.

Abbreviations:

ch (chain)	dc (double crochet)
sl st (slip stitch)	sp (space)

Gauge: 7 Dc and 3 sps equal 2 inches.

With turquoise, starting at back point, ch 6, dc in 6th ch from hook, ch 6, turn.

Row 1: Dc in 5th ch from hook, ch 1, dc in dc below, (ch 1, sk 1 ch, dc in next ch) twice, working off last lps of last dc with bone color, ch 6, turn. Fasten off turquoise.

Row 2: Dc in 5th ch from hook, * ch 1, dc in next dc, repeat from * across, end with ch 1, (dc, ch 1, dc) in top of turning ch, ch 6, turn.

Row 3: Repeat last row, work off last 2 lps of last dc with coral, ch 6, turn. Fasten off bone.

On each of the following rows, increase 1 sp at beginning and end of each row in same manner as in row 3. Repeat row 3 for pattern, working 2 rows color stripes each of coral, cocoa, gold, blue, turquoise, bone, hot pink, coral, gold, turquoise, cocoa, bone and blue—26 more rows in all. Fasten off.

Fringe: Wind yarn around a 5-inch cardboard. Cut at one end. Fold 12 strands in half and pull through first space to right of beginning point. Draw ends through loop and tighten. Knot fringe in each space, varying the colors.
